

A Very Brief History of Comics





Jules Feiffer's Tantrum (above) from 1979 and Frank Miller's Sin City (1993) can both be linked back to Will Eisner's 1940's work on The Spirit (below left and right) with his bold use of design and freedom of pen strokes.







It is worth noting that there is an equal importance to the style of lettering employed in the design of these pages that add to the overall layout and feel for the story.



During the 1950's some Comic Books were banned because they were seen as being a corrupting influence on America's younger generations. Because of this the 1960s saw a new beginning with Superheroes such as Green Lantern / Green Arrow coming head on with racial issues whilst Spiderman tackled the problem of drugs.
